The senior farmers' market nutrition program (SFMNP) provides EBT benefits to all eligible Chickasaw seniors, Chickasaw Warrior Society members and eligible Chickasaw citizens who are considered 100% disabled and reside inside the Chickasaw Nation service area or the Oklahoma City area. In addition, they provide EBT benefits to all eligible First American seniors, 55 and older, as well as eligible non-First American seniors, 60 and older, who reside in a First American household. These EBT benefits can be used for the purchase of healthy fresh fruits and vegetables from authorized farmers markets and farm stands throughout the Chickasaw Nation.


